## REMARKS:

A possible oil slick can be seen about 11 miles to the east of East Bay in the Bird's Foot Delta region of Louisiana. Winds at this time were around 5 knots or less from the south/southeast with partly cloudy conditions throughout the northern Gulf of Mexico with relatively clear skies right over the oil site. There are oil rigs in the vicinity, including the Destroyed Taylor Platform which is located to the south/southeast about 3-4 miles, but at this time, no specific point source can be identified.
